This guarantee will have to be renewed every year and can be revoked only when the goods are exported out of Israel.</p>	Note: The guarantee covers Israeli Customs duties and taxes only, and does not cover other port related charges like NVOCC handling charges, cargo terminal charges and <u>Wharfage</u> fee.
